The SRJC Feed The Bears Food Programs is an initiative to address food insecurity on campus. The 2019 California Community Colleges #RealCollege Survey commissioned by the Chancellor's Office shows that 50% of respondents throughout the California's Community Colleges are Food Insecure.

Our own 2019 #RealCollege Survey results show that 46% of our Santa Rosa Junior College students are food insecure. This means that 46% do not have a steady source of food or cannot afford to feed themselves or their families.

The SRJC and the Student Resource Centers believe that no student should have to go hungry while pursuing their education.

We opened the Feed The Bears Pantry along with a Fresh Produce Distribution/outdoor market Summer 2018:

2018-2019 \$37,419.12 109,833.38 pounds

We are now open 4 days a week during Fall & Spring Semesters, and 2 days a week during the Summer Semester. 11:30am – 2:30pm.

Participation is growing every semester by 30 to 59%: Summer 2018 saw 95 participants. Fall 2018 saw 416 participants. Spring 2019 saw 576 participants. The 2019-2020 numbers are continuing the trend.

Our 2018 SRJC #RealCollege Survey showed 50% of our students were food insecure. The 2019 SRJC #RealCollege Survey showed 46% of our students were food insecure. Our Feed The Bears Food Programs Work. We dropped our food insecurity rate by 4%. A HUGE success!
